Notes:

- Other gods affected:
 - Wadjit: protector deity of Lower Egypt
 - o Heka: god of divine energy and magic
 - o Ma'at: goddess of order, balance, and harmony
- Demonstration of God's power and sovereignty over Egypt.
- Confrontation between Moses and Pharaoh is actually between Yahweh and the false gods of Egypt.
- Difficult to identify all the gods. Probably best not to view it so much as a one to one correlation between the plagues and a particular deity, but more as a divine judgment against all the gods collectively in that none of their gods could counter Yahweh's judgments.
